

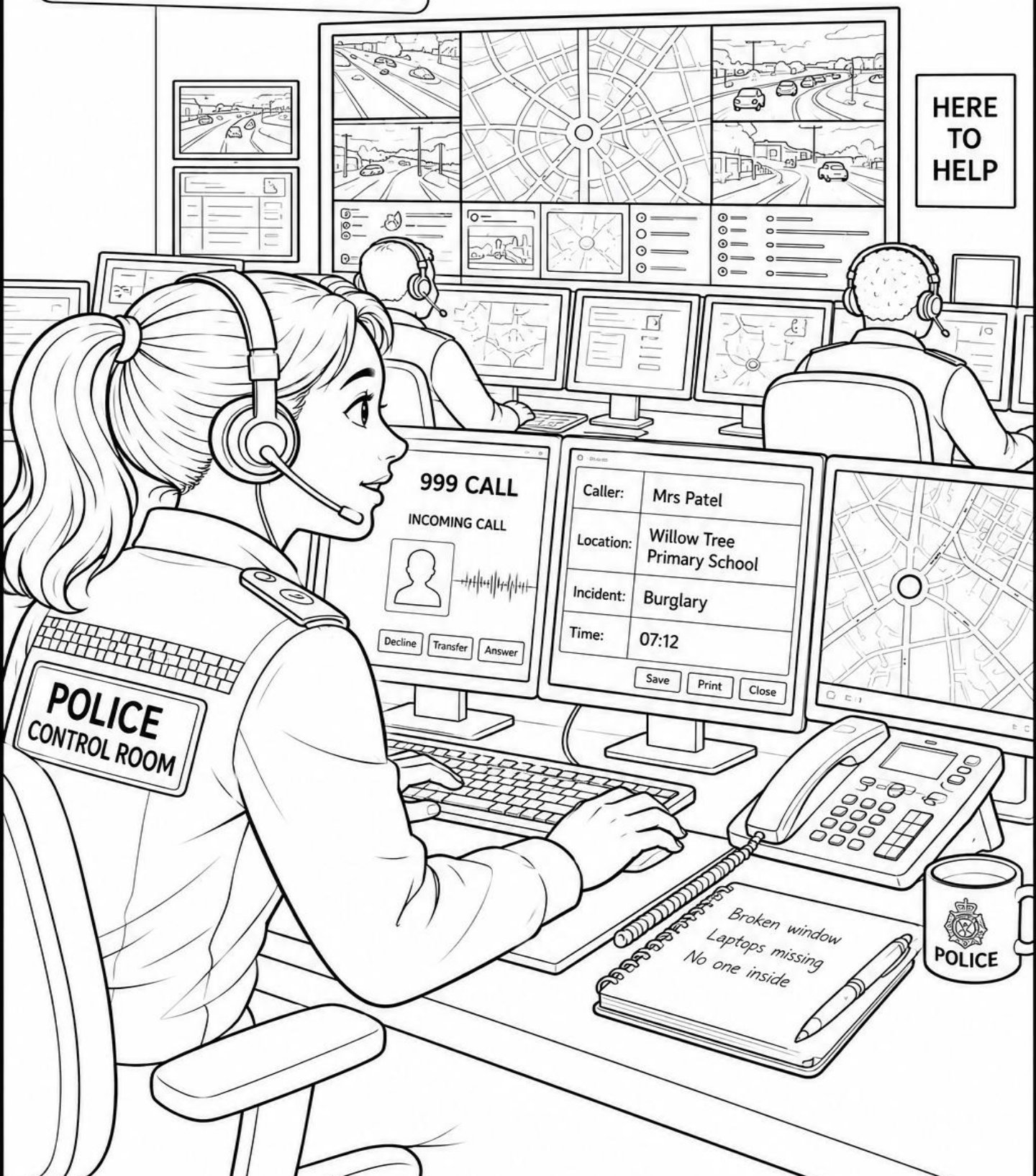

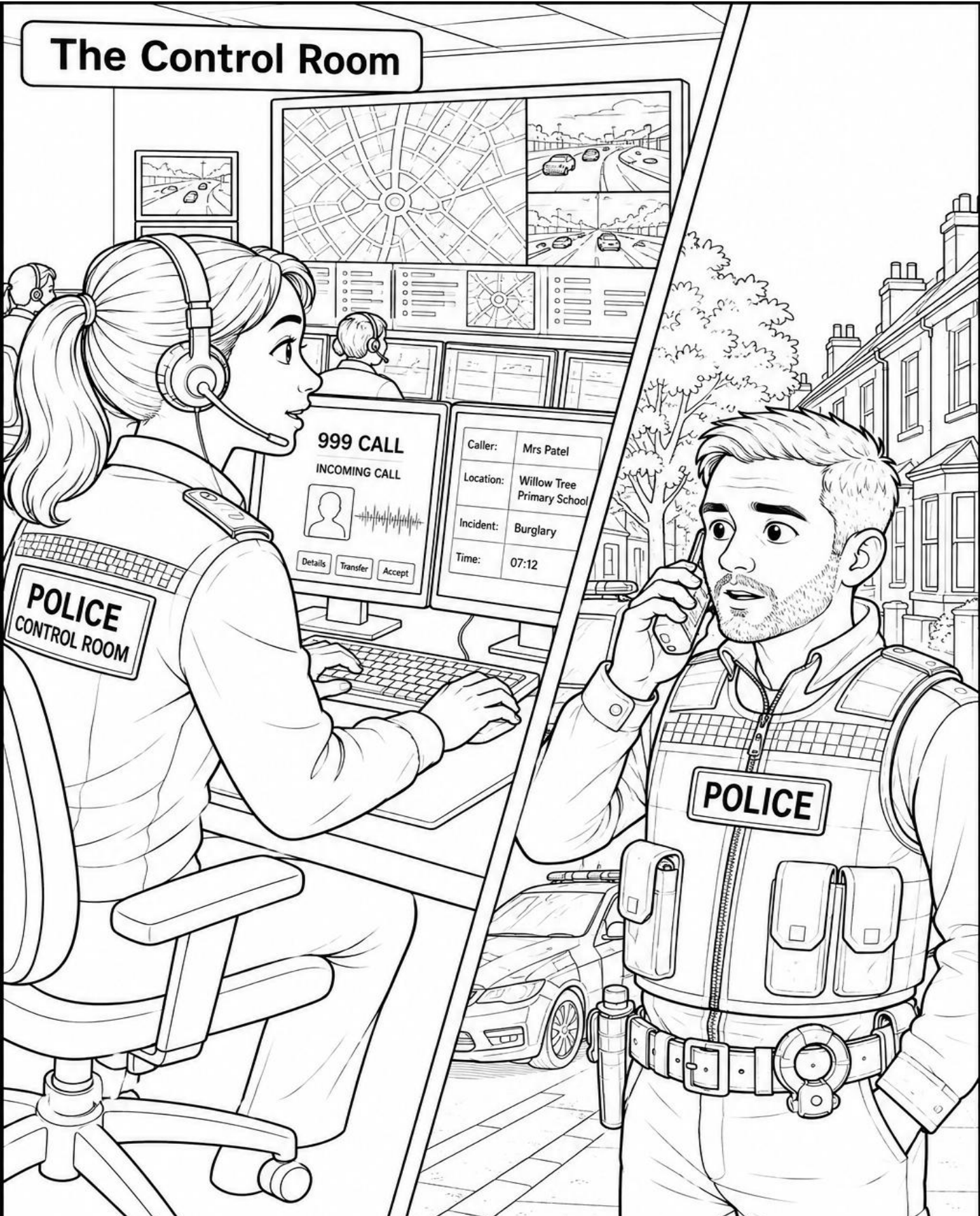

The Control Room

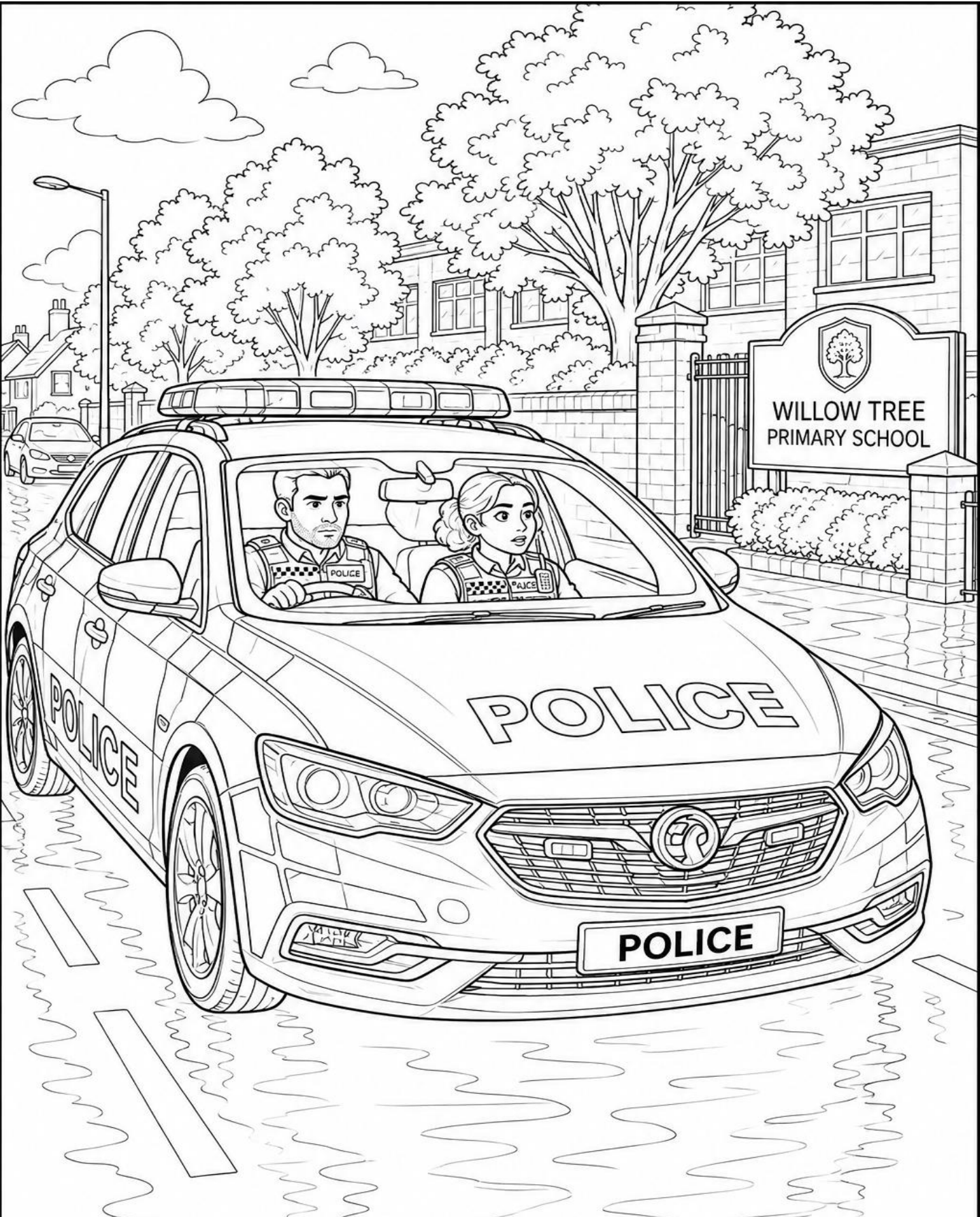

The Control Room



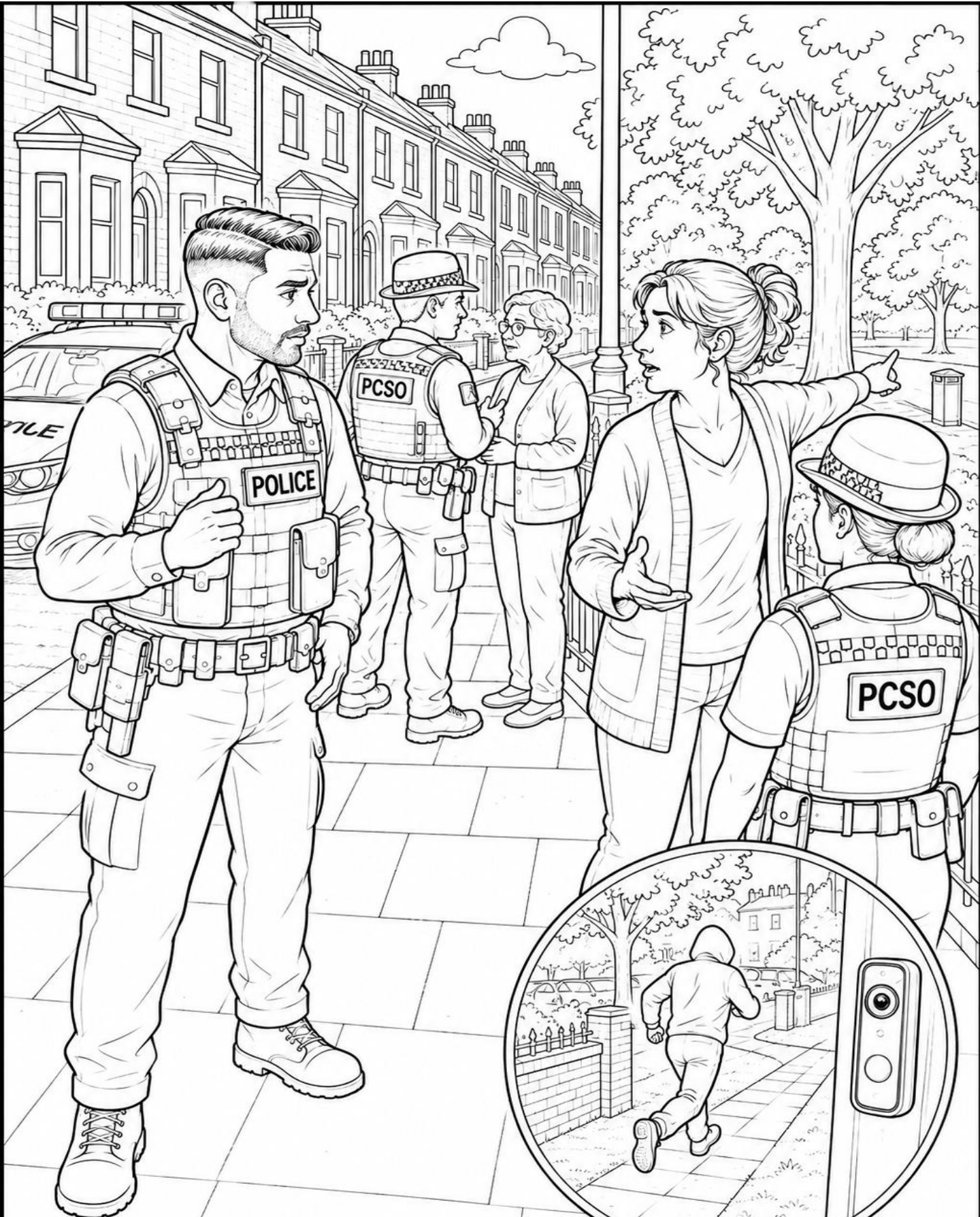
The message came over the police radio of PC Garfield. "We have a report of a possible burglary at Willow Tree Primary School." The response officers got in their car and drove to the school.



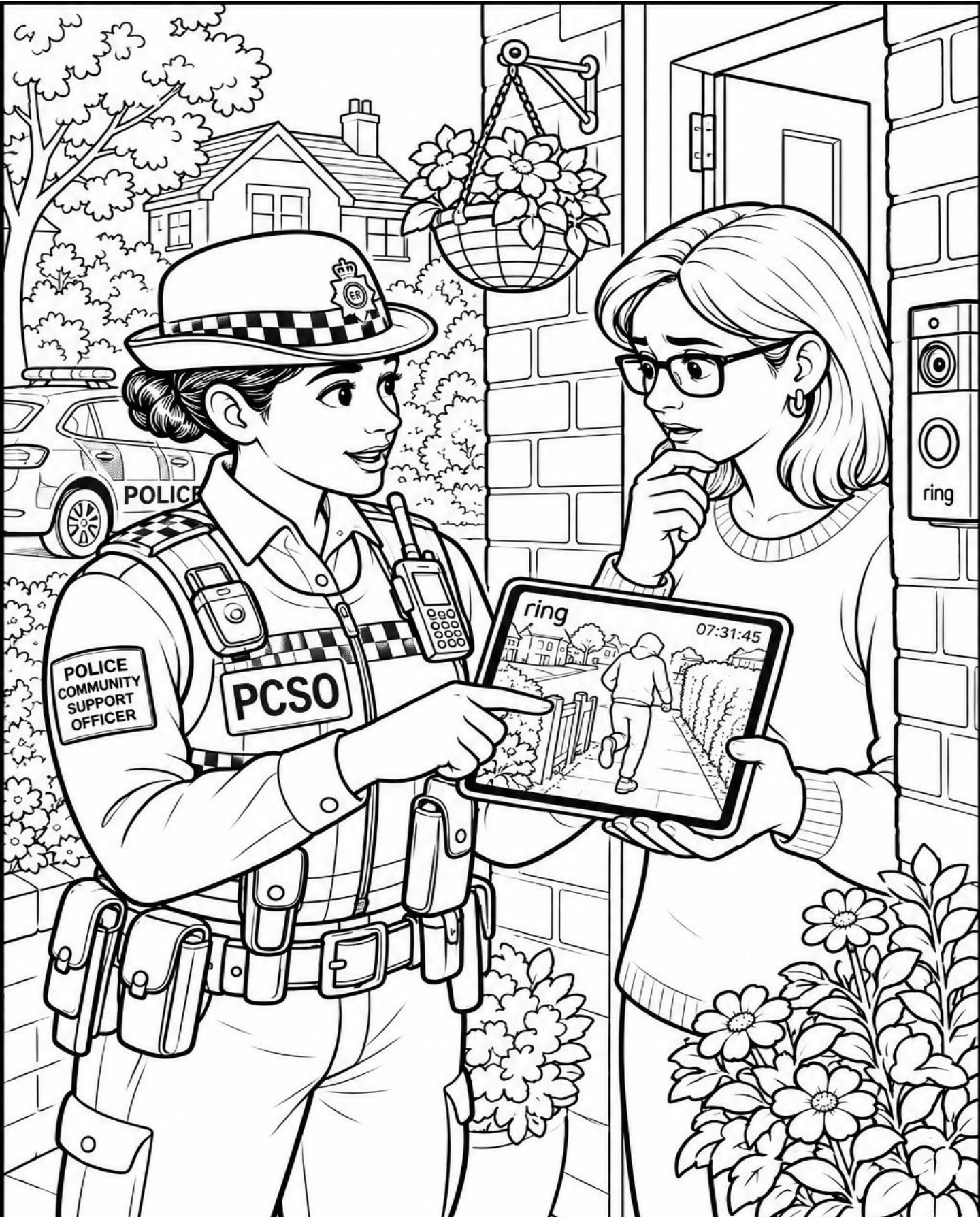
The officers arrived at the school.

More officers came to help, they started talking to local people. A neighbour spoke to the police "I saw someone running towards the park." That was an important clue.



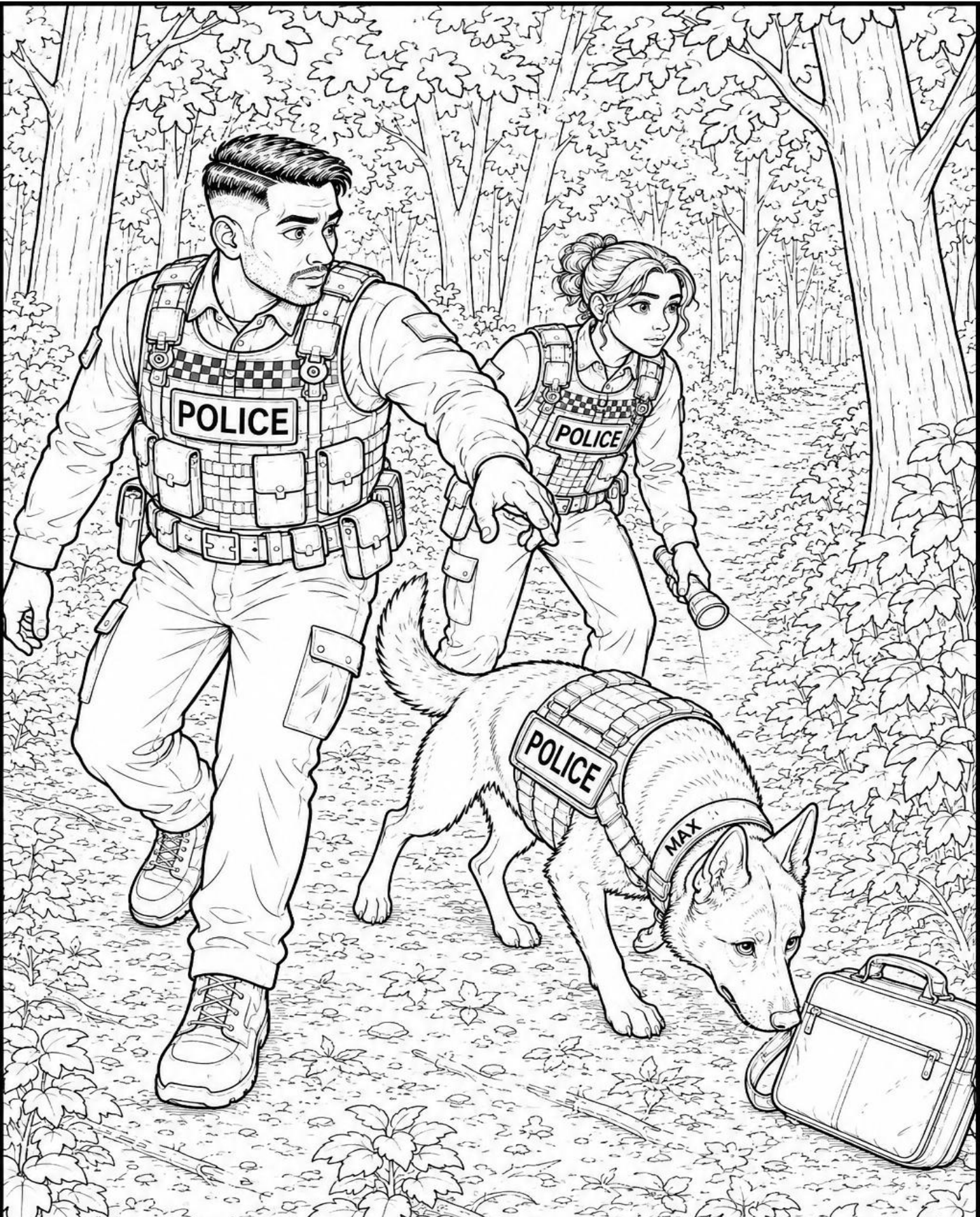

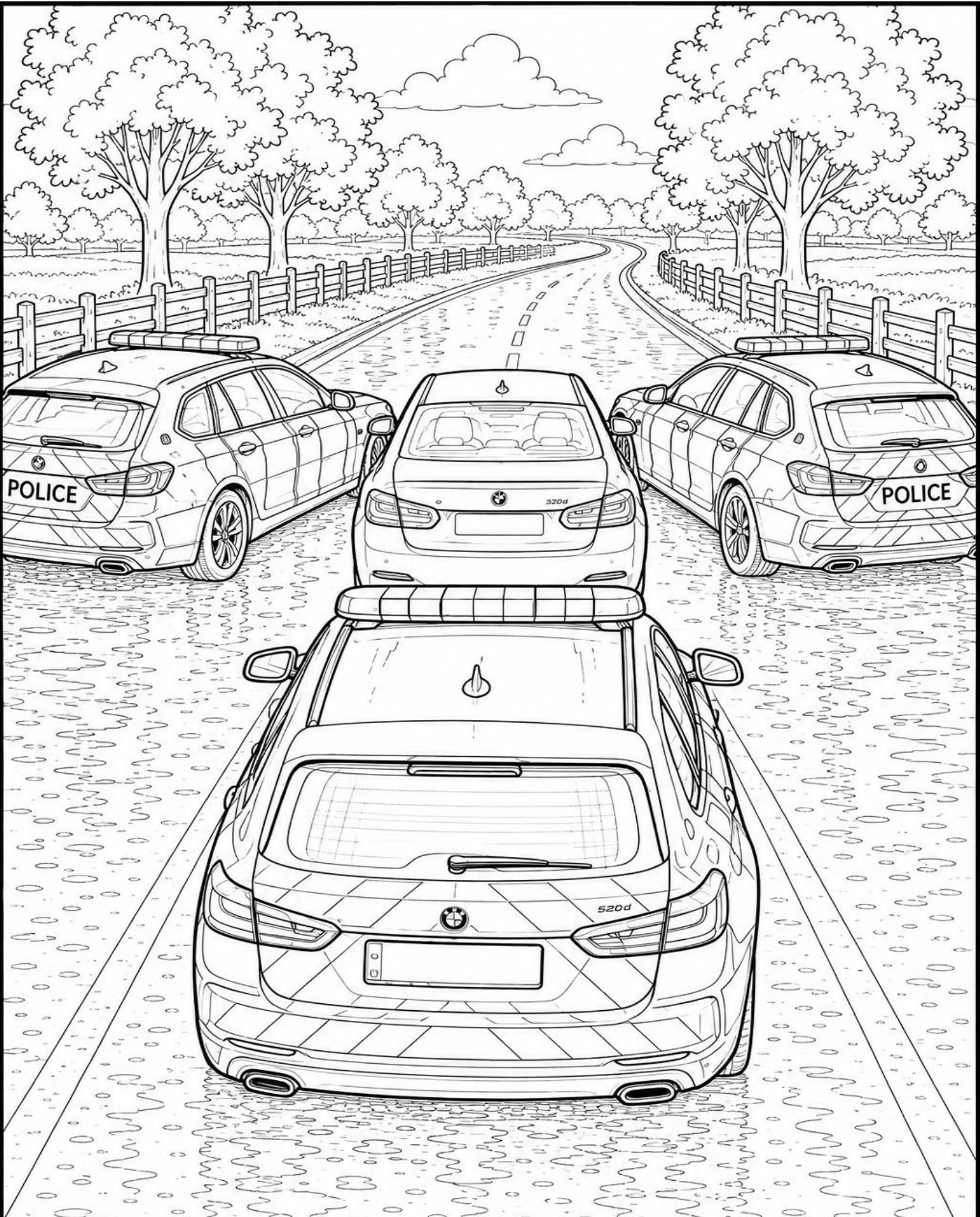
All of a sudden, Max stopped beside a tree. He had found a bag.
When the officers looked inside the bag, they found some of the missing laptops.



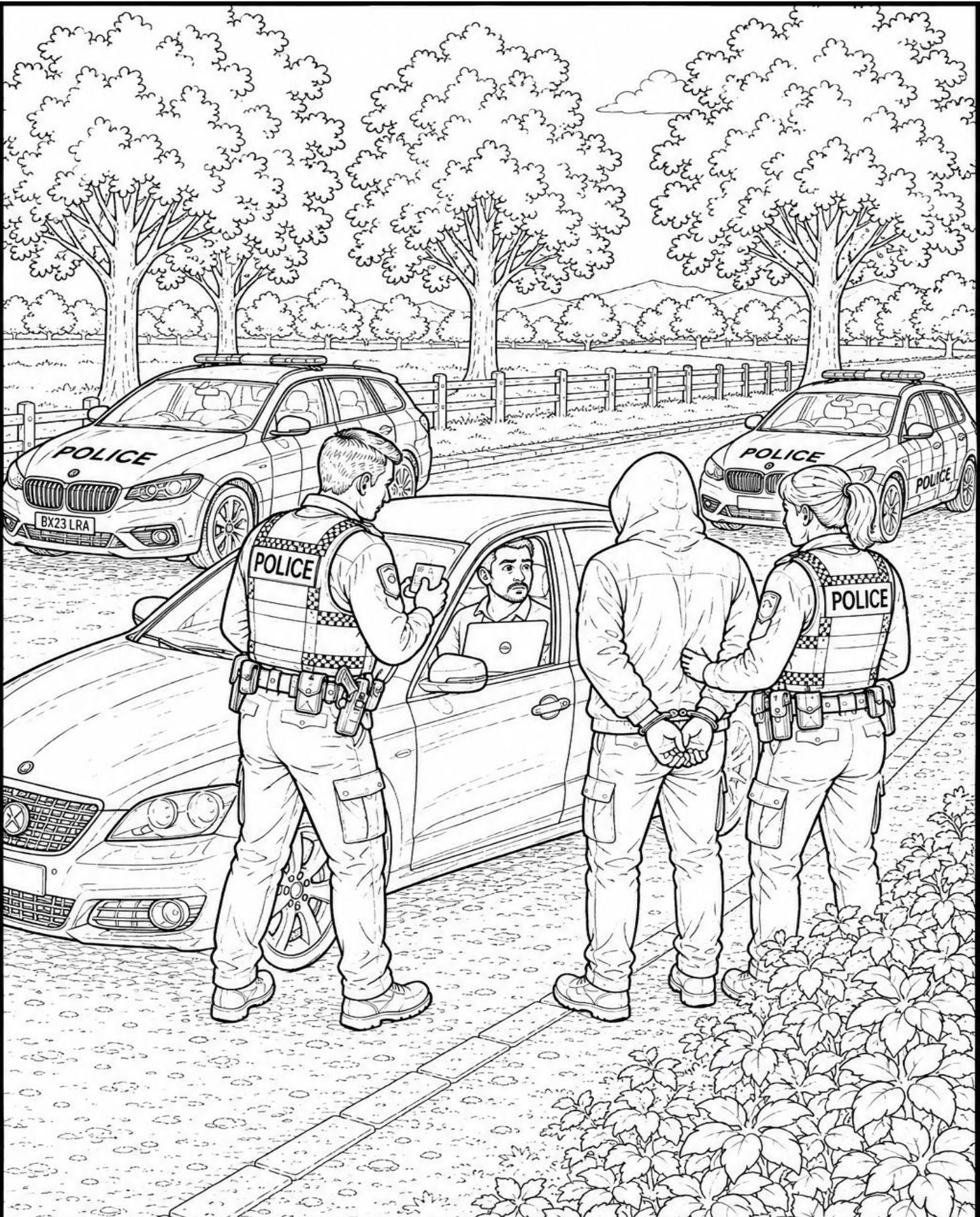

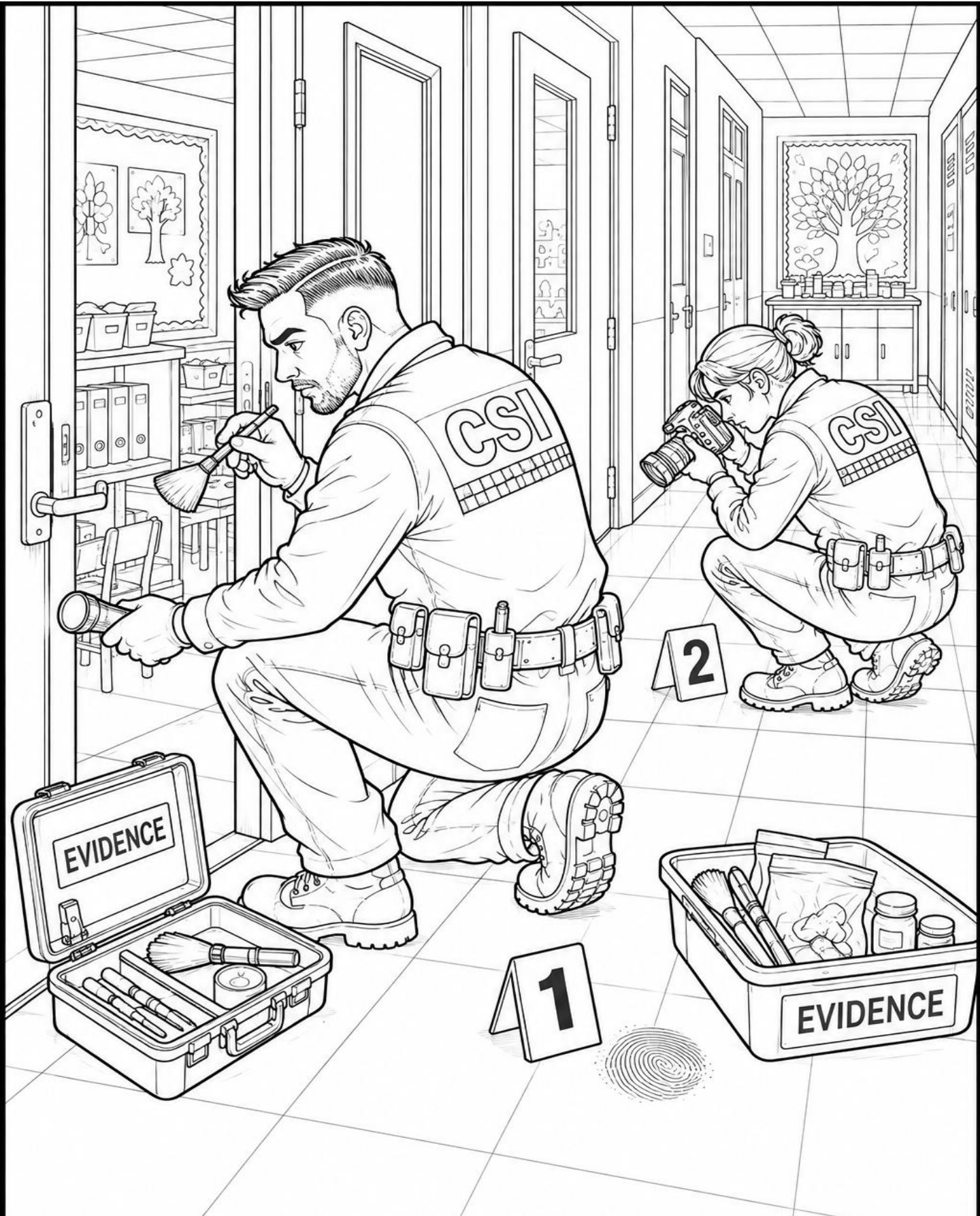

The helicopter crew told the call handler the make and number of the car. This meant the Roads policing officers were waiting ahead. They safely stopped the car, and the driver was arrested.



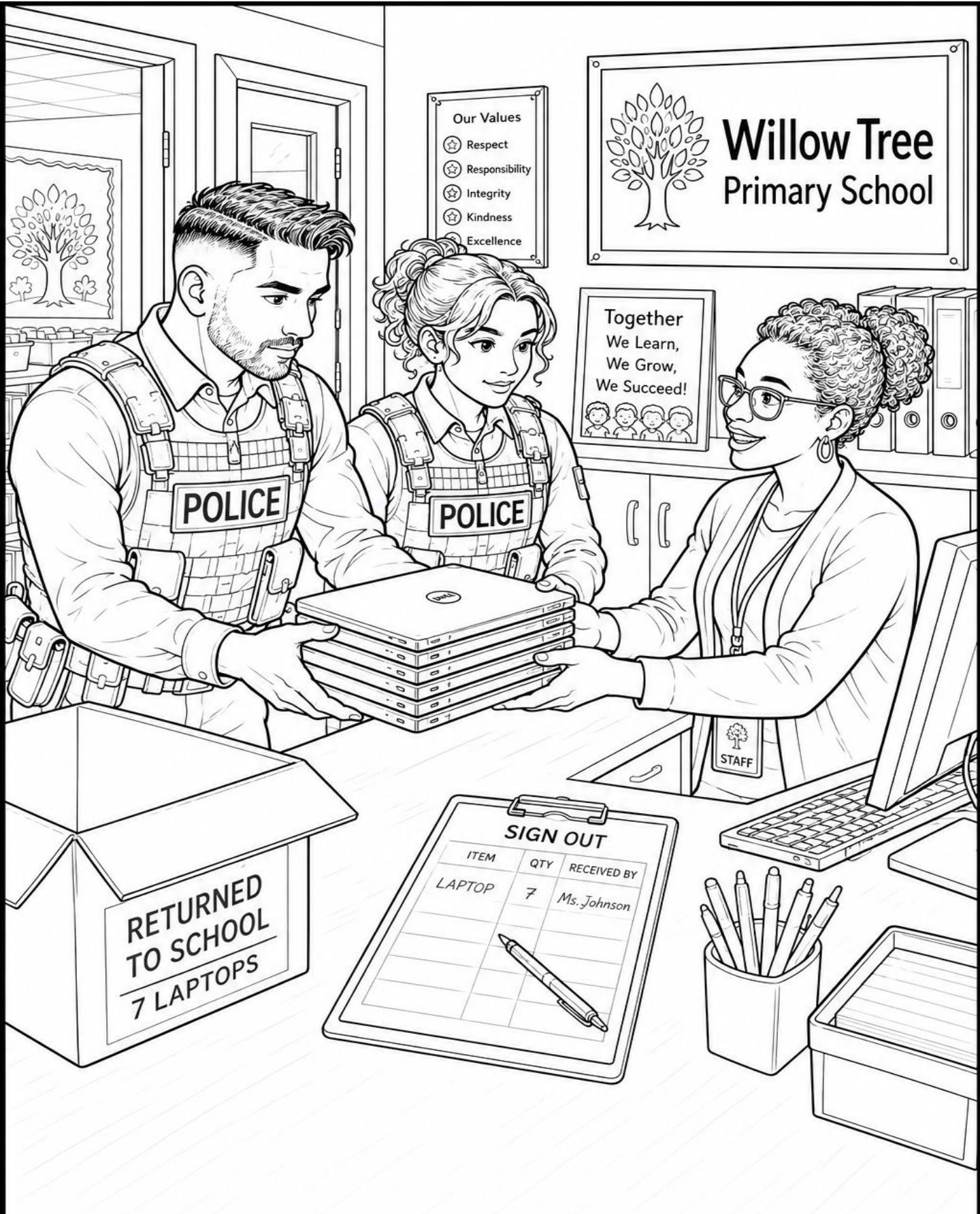
Inside the car were the rest of the laptops stolen from the school. The police now had them, but they had more work to do. They still needed the evidence that the man had broken into the school and stolen them.
